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FRED KUNDRATA EXPRESSES CONCERN ABOUT INFRASTRUCTURE AND JOBS IN SOUTHWEST OHIO

Democratic Nominee Conducts Press Conference Under Brent Spence Bridge

CINCINNATI – Fred Kundra, the Democratic nominee for U.S. Congress in Ohio’s 1st District, conducted a press conference to offer his position on the passing of the Highway and Transportation Funding Act of 2014 (H.R. 5021). Kundra questioned the actions of the 1st District’s current U.S. Representative, Steve Chabot, who was one of the 55 Representatives voting against the Bill.

“Steve Chabot voted ‘no’ to a long-term plan and ‘no’ to a short-term plan. This must mean he has no plan,” said Kundra, who spoke about the Bill and how its passage saved thousands of jobs in Southwest Ohio.

We need first-class infrastructure to keep everyone safe on our highways as they travel throughout Southwest Ohio.”
